Impact Aid Funds: Native American Participation

Pursuant to Title VIII, ESEA, Sec. 804 Impact Aid Program, and federal regulation 34 CFR 222 the Board authorizes and directs the administration to establish procedures to ensure the district may claim children residing on Indian and federally owned lands for the purpose of receiving federal funds pursuant to the Impact Aid statutes and follow the eight IPPS Standards under 34 CFR 222.95.

- 1. Give tribal officials and parents of Indian children an opportunity to comment on whether Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children in the educational programs and activities provided by the LEA.
- 2. Assess the extent to which Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children served by the LEA.
- 3. Recommend, if necessary, ways the LEA can modify its educational program to ensure that Indian children participate on an equal basis with non-Indian children served by the LEA.
- 4. Disseminate applications, evaluations, program plans and other information related to the educational programs of the LEA in a timely manner. Allow the tribes and parents of Indian children an opportunity to review the materials, provide input on the needs of the Indian children, and recommend ways the school district can help Indian children benefit from the LEA's educational programs and activities.
- 5. Gather information concerning the Indian community views on education issues, including the frequency, location and time of meetings.
- 6. Notify Indian parents and tribes of the location and times of meetings.
- 7. Consult and involve tribal officials and parents of Indian children in the planning and development of the LEA's educational programs and activities.
- 8. Modify the IPPs, if necessary, based upon input from the tribes and parents.

The policy and administrative regulation will be reviewed regularly and modified, as appropriate.

Documentation demonstrating district compliance with the requirements of this policy and law will be maintained in the district office.
